On "Mix It Up Day," students wore mismatched clothing and sat with classmates they don't normally share a table with during lunchtime. Classes also created anti-bullying posters, showcasing each student's creativity to incorporate a "Don't Dis' My Ability" theme. To wrap up the week on Friday, everyone wore their student-designed anti-bullying t-shirts, encouraging students and staff to "Respect All."
