A state-supported private school, Mill Neck Manor School for the Deaf is located in northern Nassau County. It is open to youngsters, from infancy to age 21, who are legal residents of New York State, including Long Island and the New York metropolitan area. Referrals are initiated by parents, clinics, physicians or school districts. Students benefit from specialized communication techniques, up-to-date curriculum and technology resources.
