Mill Neck currently operates four Day Habilitation programs on Long Island—one in Hicksville, a center-based program, and three that operate “without walls” in Nassau and Suffolk counties.

Program Eligibility: Participants must be waiver enrolled in Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) Medicaid system and be referred by OPWDD.
